Moultonborough Recognizes 2010 Adopt A Spot Participants

At its meeting of September 30th, the Moultonborough Board of Selectmen praised the participants in the Town's program to beautify prominent public locations by having them adopted by local businesses and individuals. In this third year of the program seven businesses or service clubs and two families adopted 9 spots throughout the community ranging from the Town entry sign at Center Harbor to the larger scale Sutherland Park.

All were given certificates of appreciation and the top three spots were given special plaques of recognition, after a judging by local gardeners. A First Place went to Miracle Farms Landscaping for their work at the Public Safety Building, Second Place went to Donnybrook Services for their work at the Community Center (Recreation), and Third Place went to Miracle Farms for the entry sign at the Center Harbor Town line.

Other participants included Al Hume at the Holland Street Transfer Station, James & Karen Nizus & Family at Playground Drive, Dion's Plant Place at the North Parking Island of Town Hall, Pine Ridge Lawn and Landscape for the front of Town Hall, Stephens Landscaping at the South Parking Island of Town Hall and the Moultonborough Lion's Club & Aubuchon Hardware at Sutherland Park.

Joel Mudgett, Chairman of the Moultonborough Selectmen said, "It is always a challenge to keep such volunteer efforts healthy and thriving. In this our third year, we can't thank these participants enough for their efforts in improving the quality of life in our community. We received many positive comments and the abundant color brought joy to many. We hope that each resident and visitor takes an opportunity to say thank you to these participants as well."
